

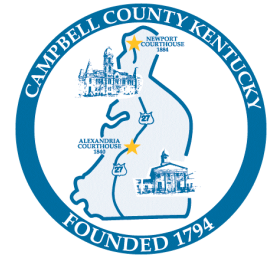

The History of River Sweep

River Sweep, sponsored by the Ohio River Valley Water Sanitation Commission (ORSANCO) and Foundation for Ohio River Education (FORE), is an annual river bank cleanup for the Ohio River and its tributaries. Throughout the years, this nationally recognized event has grown into one of the largest cleanup efforts of its kind, encompassing 1,962 miles of shoreline from Pittsburgh, PA to Cairo, IL. More than 17,000 volunteers in six states bordering the river come together to collect more than 7000 tons of trash and other debris from the banks of the Ohio River.
